

Edgar Thomson and Henry A. Thomson ^{and} qualify each to assist in chaining and marking.

I set initial post on summit, at junction of traveled roads, North (Southeast) and (South west); set post against fence on west side of lane, at said junction, 86 links wide, or 43 links west of center of lane, course north, and with a common field compass, I run thence, descending toward Dry Creek var 20° East, south on line bet, ranges 35 + 36 East point of commencing being 15 chs. North of SE Cor of Sec. 1 ^{cha} NR. 35 E.

	7.00	Set but A on post in leaning fence, on south side of traveled road, at a point 32 rods N of SE cor of said Sec 1, I turn thence,
S $32^{\circ} 30' W$	12.00	Set but A on perpendicular post in fence on N side of lane I turn, thence,
S $46^{\circ} 00' W$	19.00	Set stone marked A in small stone Md. above or N of graded road and turn thence,
S $41^{\circ} 30' W$	27.65	Set stone marked A in small stone Md. above or N of graded road and turn thence,
S $83^{\circ} 00' W$	33.25	Ravine, course S.W.; ascend,
	34.10	Set stone marked A in small stone Md. above or N of graded road, and turn thence,
S $33^{\circ} 15' W$	37.83	Set angle post above or N of graded road near summit, I turn thence,
S $65^{\circ} 00' W$	42.20	Set angle post North of graded road, thence
N $82^{\circ} 00' W$	49.90	Intersect traveled road up Dry Creek, near Res. of J. Phillips Sen. I set terminus 50 links above deep cut in graded road, at this junction of roads. All the posts are of size, and marked and set in mounds as required by law. The angle in each case indicated by common magnetic needle.
