MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES FOUND: None. Umatilla County Survey No. Q-59-B, in 1957, reported finding and holding a stone for this corner. The origin of the stone is unknown. Fences have been removed in the area and it has been farmed for wheat and is now in CRP. The stone was not recovered. Re-established the corner by holding the record angle and distance from certain found monuments recovered from Survey No. Q-59-B. See Survey filed concurrently with this corner record for angle and distance ties.

MONUMENT SET:

At reestablished corner point, set a 2" aluminum cap on a 5/8" x 24" iron rebar, with cap 12" below ground level, marked as shown in Monument Marking Detail. New accessories:

A silver deep-1 magnet, 18" below ground level, bears North 49° East, 40.0 feet. A blue deep-1 magnet 18" below ground level, bears South 23° East, 31.4 feet. A purple deep-1 magnet 18" below ground level, bears South 45 1/2° West, 39.4 feet. An orange deep-1 magnet 18" below ground level, bears North 10° West, 33.8 feet. Buried bearing object tags with deep 1 magnets.

Corner falls in a CRP field approximately 600 feet South of a fence line extending North.
