A 26" White Fir bears North 60° East, a dist. of 12.50 ft., marked S 1/16 S27 BT (tree also has BC Loc. tag). A 6" White Fir bears North 64° West, a dist. of 20.45 ft., marked S 1/16 S28 BT.

Set steel fence post approx. 1 ft. South.
