DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found 8"x4"x3" stone, firmly planted, with chiseled X and fence post alongside, as noted in Survey 06-103-Ax. Stone falls 1.6 ft. South and 7.19 ft. East of position determined by survey. As Survey 06-103-Ax does not indicate how he arrived at the position, I reject this stone.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO MONUMENT THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position determined by survey, I set a $5/8" \times 30"$ iron pin, 27" in the ground, with a 2 1/2" aluminum cap, marked as shown below, from which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

An 8"x4"x3" stone bears South 77° East, a distance of 7.35 feet, marked X, with fence post 0.5 feet North of stone. A 7" White Fir bears North 18° West, a distance of 7.50 feet, marked S 1/16 S33 BT.

Set steel fence post 0.3 feet Northeasterly.
