## Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 21" brass cap on a 2" iron pipe 8" above the ground

A fir snag 42" diam. bears S 76° E., 72.6 ft.(110 lks) dist. with R 38 E S 6 visible inside 8" of overgrowth. A fir snag 42" diam. bears N 44° W., 48.8 ft.(74 lks) dist. with no visible scribe marks.
