Description of corner evidence found:

I found the remnant of a face with the scribing N R 37 E S lying by a four way fence corner post and a stone set by the post with 6 notches on the south face and an x on the top of the stone. After tying this stone to my extensive co-ordinate system, I found the position to be harmonious with the surrounding evidence and found corners in the area, thus I determined the stone to be a perpetuation of the original section corner even though I could not find any recorded record of the stone.
