## History of original corner establishment:

Corner established in 1882 by George S. Pershin:

Set a basalt stone 15" x 8" x 5", 10" in ground on east slope in open glade for  $\frac{1}{4}$  section corner marked " $\frac{1}{4}$ " on north face. No trees near. Raised a mound of stone alongside in lieu of pits.



## Description of corner evidence found:

Original corner stone, set in a mound of stones, is marked "14" on the north face. Stone measures  $16" \times 9" \times 5"$ 

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

I moved corner stone aside and in it's place I set a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" flared iron pipe with a 3" brass cap attached. I deposit corner stone alongside and build mound of stones around the pipe to the brass cap.

From which bears:

A 23" Ponderosa Pine, N.50°E, 66.1 ft. scribed " $\frac{1}{4}$  S.12 BT" on double blazes.

A 13" Ponderosa Pine, S.48° 30'E., 59.7 ft. scribed " $^{\prime\prime}_4$  S.13 BT" on double blazes.
