Description of corner evidence found:

Found old mound of stone in fence corner. Mound does not appear to be a fence jack. No stones with marks visible.

Found old pine stump, burned and rotten, bears N26°W, 93 ft. from mound of stone. Due to harmony with found corners 5 & W, I accepted the mound of stone as the corner position.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set 3"x30" galv. iron pipe with 3" brass cap stamped as shown on the diagram, set 24 inches in the ground and placed ammound of stone around the pipe.

No bearing trees are available.

Set a steel post with warning sign, North alongside pipe.
