History of original corner establishment: General Land Office:

Nm. H. Odell & Nm. S. Lewis, Deputy Surveyors, Contract No. 110, dated 7 February, 1865. "Set a post corner for Townships 5 \$ 6 North, Ranges 37 \$ 38 East, from which: A Fir 20 in. dia., bears NT°W, 23 lks. A Fir 20 in. dia., bears NI8°E, 221ks. A Fir 20 in. dia., bears Nio E, 22ks. A Fir 20 in. dia., bears 540°E, 18 iks. A Fir 10 in. dia., bears 523°W, 24 iks. Geo. Williams, Deputy Surveyor, Contract No. 176, dated 20 July, 1872. "Intersect town line, north boundary of Twns. 170 lks. west of Cor. for Twns. 5 \$ 6 N., R. 37 \$ 38 E". Description of evidence found: June 23, 1956: Bert Udell (notes taken off of an Aluminum location poster set by Udell on a 24 in. dia. Grand Fir, as these are the only record of his visit): "Ch. 2640 ft. South of good 1/4 corner Ch. 26325 ft. West of good 1/4 corner Ch. 26325 ft. East of old scribed stake in fence going west but I do not have notes. No BT's, not chained south. There is an old knot with transit tack 5' north and 50' east with 3 old scarred BT' but not original. Don't know if record." Udell set a tractor axie with an "X" stamped on the top of the tapered spindle at this point, which lies 564°E a distance of 9.0 feet from the tree bearing the location poster marked as noted. as noted. The Bureau of Land Management ran a traverse line through this location within the last 5 years and dissected several of the larger Grand Firs in the vicinity but did not recover original evidence, nor set any monumentation. Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: July 29, 1992: Gregory A. Crites, Registered Professional Land Surveyor, Oregon No. 1887, and John Hopkins, headchainman: Set I-1/2" standard "Hoffland" galvanized iron pipe with 2-1/2" Bronze cap mkd. as shown on page 2, in mound of stone, from which: The original 10" dia. Fir (now 44" dia.) (523°W 24 lks.) bears \$29°00'W 15.84 feet to original face with scribing. The BL.M. dissected part of this tree and recovered a "cruisers mark" "T" of unknown origin in an upper face at a depth of 16 years, more or less. The BL.M. dissected in all four quadrants of this tree, but found no other evidence. This live tree stands at the northwest corner of a barbed wire fence. I dissected this tree to a depth of 127 years, more or less, by expanding the cuts made by the BL.M. on the face pointing N25°E, and lowering my cut so that it would fail within 2 feet of the ground surface (the tree was only 10° dia. when originally marked, so I presumed the face would be close to the ground). We recovered the original marks at this point. No trace remains of the other 3 original bearing trees. The tractor axie with "X" stamped on a tapered spindle as established by Bert Udell in 1956 lies N46"38'41"W a distance of 106.15 feet.
