## History of original corner establishment:

In 1872, under G.L.O. Contract No. 176, George Williams set post for corner to 8, 9, 16 & 17 on a steep ridge from which a Red Fir 12" in diameter bears N37<sup>0</sup>W, 83 lks. dist. A Red Fir 7" in diameter bears S280W, 84 1ks dist.

A resurvey was done by George R.and William E. Campbell in 1899 under G.L.O. Contract No. 699. They found the corner and BT's set by Williams and destroyed marks on S.W. BT.

## Description of corner evidence found:

At corner location found unrecorded mound of stones from which a 30" Douglas Fir stump bears  $N36^0W$  54.8 ft. Portion of tree is lying near stump with good scribing "S8 B". A 16" D. Fir, alive and in good condition, with open face and no marks visible, bears S180 W. 55.4 ft. (marks were destroyed in 1899).



R 38E S8 BT A Douglas Fir 8" dia. bears S 710 W, 26.9 ft. scribed T5N R38E S17 BT.

Attached 54-3 and 54-4 signs to all BT's. Attached brass washer stamped LS 1294 to foot blaze of new BT's. Painted blazes and 6" band around new BT's Red.
