The original bearing tree, now a 26" Douglas Fir, alive and in good condition, previously opened partially by chainsaw and axe, but not to scribed face, bears $S16\frac{1}{2}^{0}W$ 84.5 ft.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At corner location set a 1"x30" Galvanized Pipe with 3" brass cap stamped:

Set pipe 20" in ground with original stone buried alongside. Built mound of stone to cap.

A 26" dia. Douglas Fir bears S1612⁰W 84.5 ft.

A Bearing Object:
